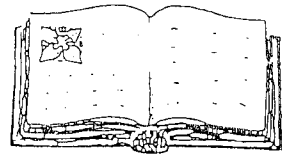


During November we pray especially for our loved ones who have died. Please enter their names in the Book of Remembrance at the front of the church.

If you can help with these or in any other way, please put your name on the list.

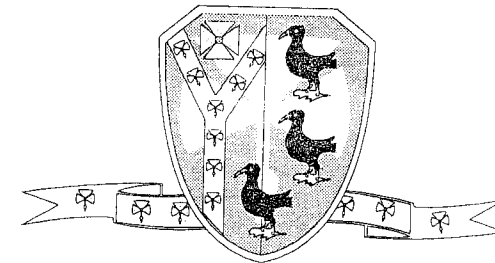

Tuesday Parish Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Rosary:

6pm - Rosary 6.30pm – Mass followed by Novena.

Every Tuesday we ask our parish patrons, Our Lady of Perpetual Help and St. Thomas of Canterbury to intercede for our Parish and our families. This is a very important part of our parish life and we encourage everyone to attend.

The Rosary is also said very Sunday at 9.30am before Mass.

Confessions: Confessions every Sunday 9.30am to 9.55am (during Rosary).

Adoration: There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on the 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month from 5.45pm till 6.30pm. This will continue depending on the number of people who attend. **Ministers of the Eucharist and Ministers of the Word are highly encouraged to attend.**



The Archdiocese hearing in the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse (IICSA) begins in London on Monday 12th November and runs until Friday 16th November.
