How do you know love?

How do we know what love is? You cannot 'Google-it', you cannot bottle it and sell it as a perfume, you cannot slice and dice it or see it under a microscope. Instead it is shown to us through our lives. Love is wanting to be with the other person. We are shown it in the love of a parent for a child or in the relationship between a bride and bridegroom. These are examples of human love. How do we know God's love? It is by the way in which He shows it to us—how He lives with us. As Saint John says: "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us" (1 John 4:19). This love is shown by Jesus on the Cross.

Perhaps we could show in our lives how much we love Jesus in return by the sign of the Cross more often. Early Christians used it when they were crossing thresholds or going on journeys. It was a sign of their love for God's love for them. The Cross is the sign, not of defeat or failure, but the power of God's love to triumph over sin and death. As Saint Paul says: "May I never boast except in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Galatians 3:13).

WORD THIS WEEK

On Passion (Palm) Sunday the Gospel *{Mark 14:1-15:47}* dominates the celebration, and, in a sense, its meaning is obvious. Do not allow this, however, to detract from the other readings, which give the vital context necessary for understanding the Passion as much more than a simple story. It is THE story of God achieving salvation by the supreme sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Thus the immense depth of the Isaiah reading *{Isaiah 50:4-7}* - a personal testimony to suffering - should open our hearts to understand more of the depth of Jesus' sacrifice.
